Did you know over 70% of Seafood consumed in Australia is imported from over seas even though we are surrounded by the worlds most pristine coast lines.

Australia has some of the best managed fisheries in the entire world and we import fish. What is even crazier is that there is no law to enforce cooked seafood retailers to inform their customers of country of origin.

Because there is no law around this most fish & chip shops pass off cheaper inferior products like Basa (Imported From Vietman) as local snapper or Imported Chinese Shark as Local W.A Shark!

Unfortunately, this is common practice in the fish & chip industry. As a consumer how can you tell if your buying exactly what the fish & chip shop is saying?

4 Steps to Know if it's Local:

- They display their fish in a cabinet so you can see exactly what it is.
- The country of origin is written on the menu. Most shops will leave their menus vague so you assume its local.
- The fish is reasonably priced. Unfortunately, the age old adage if it sounds to good to be true it probably is! Local cooked Snapper cannot retail \$6-\$10 a piece, that is below cost.
- If in doubt or unsure speak to the staff or shop owner. Shops that are doing the correct thing are more then happy to talk about where the fish comes from.

What to do if you think someone is selling imported fish as local fish? Simple just report them to Fisheries they will then investigate.

From day one at Tankk we have always shown country of origin & now a leader in the fish & chip industry in Perth we feel it's our duty to not only inform customers more but to also to tell the fisherman story.
